Notes:

1. The chair of the department-level faculty evaluation committee should affix their seal next to scores assigned by the committee. The seal must not cover any text or numbers.
2. The score for the “Education” row shall be assigned by the College Review Committee and reviewed by the College Faculty Evaluation Committee. Members of the College Faculty Evaluation Committee do not need to assign a score.
3. The score for the “External publication review” field shall be the weighted average score of the external publication review. Members of the College Faculty Evaluation Committee do not need to assign a score.
4. A blank score in the “Score reviewed by the College Faculty Evaluation Committee” column shall indicate that the College Faculty Evaluation Committee agrees with the score assigned by the competent scoring committees. The maximum score for each item may not exceed the assigned weight indicated on the scoring sheet.
5. The threshold for a passing score is 70.
6. A candidate is considered to have passed the review if they receive a passing score from at least two thirds of the members of the College Faculty Evaluation Committee.
7. Department-level faculty evaluation committees must provide concrete reasoning or indicate specific achievements if they wish to assign a score of 90 or above for any of the applicable scoring items:
